

PCCW Meeting Minutes

February 9, 2018

Opening

The regular meeting of the PCCW was called to order at 10:10a.m.on February 9, 2018. Thirteen (13) members were present.

Approval of Minutes: Minutes of the January meeting were read and approved.

Financial Report: Treasurer was absent due to illness. Kathy reported 6 hot pads were purchased at \$14.95 each. Receipts for rummage sale expenses were turned in by Kathy Strader.

Report of Officers: President: Kathy reported CAM served a total of 45,362 people, 600 seniors received a box of food and 3,300 children were fed through CAM. Kathy asked if anyone was interested in going to the DCCW Spring Assembly in Cape Girardeau. No members would be attending as it conflicts with our rummage sale. Kathy asked if anyone was interested in attending the RCCW meeting at Our Lady of the Cove in Kimberling City on March 1, 2018. Kathy, Janet, Dorothy, Barbara and Trudy planned on attending. They requested a raffle item. Barbara suggested an Angel from the United Design Corp collection. Everyone thought it was a good idea.

Vice President: Nancy Thomas reported on up-coming events: RCCW meeting on March 1st at Our Lady of the Cove, Women's Retreat on March 3rd at Our Lady of the Ozarks. Start time 0900 with breakfast at 0830. Cost \$5.

Parish Council Report: Sister Charlotte reported on church needs and repairs. Gathering space needs new lighting and bell for bell tower.

Unfinished Business:

The Soup Supper was a success. Fifty were in attendance. 13 different soups were served, sampler bowls were a hit. Cost \$70.19/ profit \$194.81. All had a good time. Left-Right-Center game was fun and popular.

New Business: The PCCW ad in the church bulletin is up for renewal at a cost of \$100 for the year. A motion was made and approved to renew the PCCW ad in the bulletin. Help is needed in jewelry during the up-coming rummage sale. Jan, Fran and Pam volunteered to help. Kathy asked for volunteers to organize the Easter Breakfast. Sandy and Nancy T volunteered. The menu will include: 12 egg casseroles, 6 hash brown casseroles, fruit, pastries/donuts, juice and coffee. Saturday, March 31st will be prep day. Church will be decorated following food preparation. This is a free breakfast for the Parish. Sister Charlotte discussed the Easter egg hunt for the small and middle school children. Some eggs will have the children's names to assure everyone receives his or

her special egg. Sister asked for candy donations to fill the eggs. A sign-up sheet for the Women's Retreat was passed around and Sister Charlotte discussed the theme for the retreat Amazing Grace. She also provided an update on renovation needs in her office.

Janet as part of the spirituality report read the article she submitted to the RCCW regarding Jane Carr.

Discussion on the St. Patrick's Day Dinner and Silent Auction – menu will consist of corned beef & cabbage, carrots, potatoes. Irish beef stew, lime jello salad, rolls/bread, desserts and beverage. Tickets will go on sale after Mass on Sunday, March 11th and cost \$10. Children 12 and under are free. Ticket takers will be Trudy 4-4:45, Fran 4:45-5:30 and Dee from 5:30 -6:00pm. Family and friends are invited. Set-up, decorations and food preparation will be on Friday, March 16th after Mass. Barbara discussed silent auction needs, donations currently received and asked for help at close of auction. The PCCW will donate a "Mystery Box" and doll cradle filled with baby items. We will continue with 50/50. Tickets will be sold at the door. Tables will be closed out at different times. The proceeds from the auction will go towards bell or lights for the gathering space. Barbara asked for additional help at auction tables during the time guests pick up items.
